The author claims that the problem is that the tradition of legal positivism of a modern sovereign state excises the experiential, or bodily, meanings from the written language of the posited rules/norms, thereby forgetting the very pre-legal authorising origin of the posited norms that each philosopher admits as offering the finality that legal reasoning demands if it is to be authoritative.

In an effort to extend our study on the relationship between overnight and intraday returns, we expand the study horizon to include more recent, relatively "calm" market years.
